Ascension Lutheran To Present Musicales

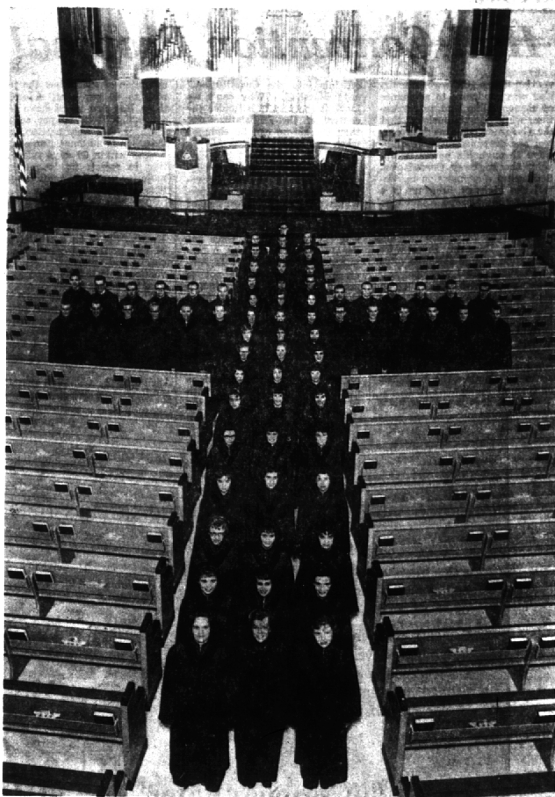

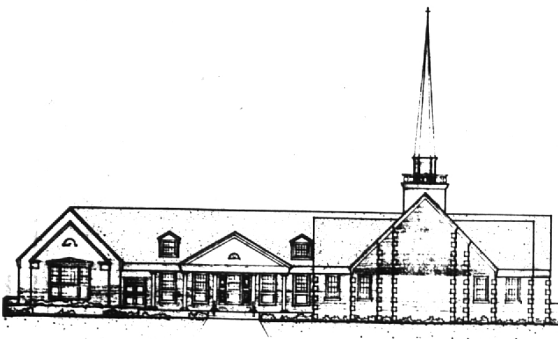

This architect's drawing shows Embury Methodist Church's proposed renovation of and addition to its present building at 1803 E. 14 Mile Road in Birmingham. The project, including remodeling of the present classrooms (extreme left of photograph), an educational unit and office

(center) and a new larger sanctuary (right), is estimated to cost \$169,000 and a total of \$270,000 when finished. Funds for the project will be solicited through a stewardship crusade beginning April 26. Architect is Elgin P. Fruder.
