

Piety Hill Chapter Plans Annual Meet

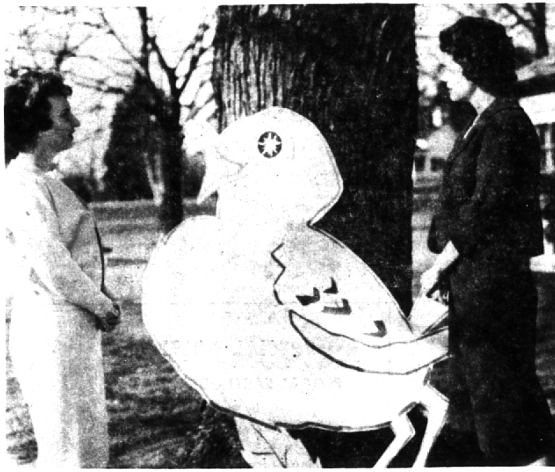

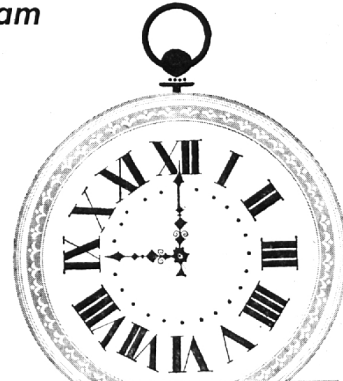
