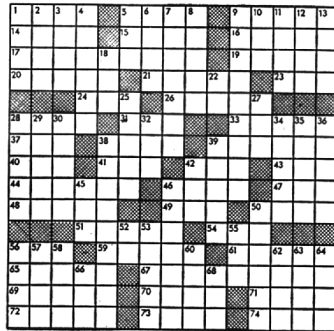


**Artist Exhibits Work**

front to debrief men right after their mission and to piece together the real story.

THIS SYSTEM was adopted as official research procedure. But Marshall's influence on military writing has gone way beyond the official record. He has written 10 of his own books and has edited or assisted with some 300 others. Countless other books have been based directly on his notes.

There are many yet to come: his memoirs of World War II ("From Where I Sat"—to be published "when the actors are gone"); "Best in Battles" (already done—a story of the most unusual situations he's encountered in war); a two-volume history of World War I; a secret history of the Korean War and an endless number of articles and book reviews for magazines.

Mrs. (Cate) Marshall is as fascinating and accomplished a person as her husband.

A FORMER Powers model, navy instructor and now acting student of Hebrew, she is taking their 11-year-old daughter, Sharon, to Israel this June. Sam will be baby sitting with the two younger girls, Katie, 7, and Bridget, 6.

Along with the baby sitting, book writing and news assignments, Marshall will be painting—his newest hobby. If history repeats itself, he will wind up an artist, for he is a man who accomplishes whatever he sets out to do.

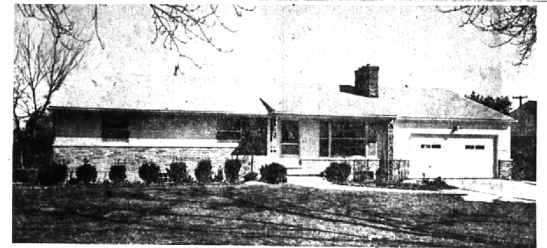
