10 Fitness

THE COUNCIL would like to make recommendations to both the schools and also the parents in order to obtain a high standard of physical well being for the entire community.

To the schools we recommend: 1. At least one-half hour daily be spent at all grade levels on supervised vigorous activity. (The elementary schools have already had this time set aside for daily gym activity—it is now the responsibility of the principal of each school to see that the home room teacher complies with this requirement.) 2. A stronger intramural program that involves participation of the remaining 85 per cent of the boys and girls not in organized athletics. 3. Increased availability of present facilities—that is, the pools and gyms be made available with supervision after school, evenings, on Saturdays and during the summer months. 4. A study be made of the lunch room diets with the goal of providing an alternate low calorie diet for those who may require it. 5. More emphasis placed on the girls participation in the fitness program. 6. No excuses (except medical) be allowed for the children for lack of participation in physical education classes; conflict in schedule should not be considered a valid excuse.

TO THE PARENTS we suggest: 1. That your children get proper rest, frequent medical examinations (particularly for ages 10-16 age group), good nutrition, lots of fresh air and exercise. 2. You may boys that give children a good workout, such as horizontal bars that fit in a doorway. Then encourage the child to chin himself as he passes through. Try the climbing ropes, traps, handgrip sets, deck and table tennis, balance beam, turning bar, or a tether ball. 3. Most important, give your children a work schedule which includes moving the lawn, shoveling snow, car washing or other jobs which provide healthful physical activity. 4. Insist that your children walk or ride their bikes to school and during part in games and sports establish a life-time habit of physical activity. 5. At home, make arrangements for family participation, in hiking, camping, swimming, water skiing, ice skating, etc.; especially outdoors. Children who find pleasure in taking part in games and sports establish a life-time habit of physical activity. Thinking parents who wish their children to develop fully have a big part to play in creating an atmosphere that encourages youngsters to develop excellent patterns of health and fitness. In this manner, parents and children alike will attain the goal of physical well being.
