**Hills Elects Bugas; Craig Named Pro-tem**

John S. Bugas, who served a term as mayor in 1957, was elected mayor of Bloomfield Hills unanimously by the Hills City Commission Tuesday night.

Bugas, vice president of Ford Motor Co. in charge of industrial relations, succeeds James A. Beresford.

Bugas thanked the commission for its vote of confidence and promised, "I will do my best to serve faithfully until the next election."

LYMAN J. CRAIG was elected mayor pro-tem, replacing Bugas. Robert J. Stadler was re-elected

city clerk-treasurer for the 14th consecutive year.

City Manager Elmer Kephart was renamed assessor and deputy clerk-treasurer. Kephart and Commissioner Robert A. Frye were named to the city planning commission as ex-officio members.

Board of review members will be elected in February, 1963.

Stadler reported that the integration of the city's police and fire departments "was running smoothly." The program provides for the policemen and firemen to switch jobs for a 30-day period for additional training.

A RESOLUTION was approved in principle for the development of a subdivision water system in Bloomfield Hills.

A proposal to beautify the north side of Portland Road was approved. A sum not to exceed \$300 was allocated to the Birmingham Landscape Service, Inc., 28825 Evergreen, for the planting of trees.

The commission also voted to participate in the exchange of mayors with New Baltimore May 21 as part of Michigan Week.

**Troy Commission Asks Phone Change Or Michigan Bell**

The Troy City Commission has asked Michigan Bell Telephone to extend the Troyian telephone exchange to all users of the Ullyses exchange within Troy.

The request is an aftermath of a mail survey conducted by the phone company and Troy of all Ullyses users living in the city.

Residents have been pushing for the change for almost two years. They say Ullyses numbers force them to pay higher rates than other Troy residents on calls to the rest of South Oakland County.

Michigan Bell will have to petition the Michigan Public Service Commission for the authority to make the change.

**Mayors Ask Strike Talks On 12-Town**

A letter expressing concern over the work stoppage on the Twelve Town drain will be sent to contractors, union and Federal mediators by the South Oakland mayors.

The mayors have decided to formally urge quick settlement of the five-week stoppage of most of the underground workers.

Most of the underground construction workers walked off their jobs March 1 when negotiations for higher pay scales proved fruitless. Workers on the open cut jobs also quit work briefly but are back on the job.

THE MAYORS said they were not interested in becoming involved in the negotiations but were concerned about the delay in construction the stoppage has caused.

They were especially concerned over a danger of shifting on Stephenson Highway in Madison Heights and the costs of the Dequindre Interceptor and Red Run enclosures not yet bid.

Union officials agreed several weeks ago to let emergency crews bolster the Stephenson site. It was feared the roadway might collapse.
