Report Expenses In Tax Returns

R. I. Nixon, District Director of internal revenue, recently restated the Internal Revenue Service position regarding employee reimbursed expenses and expense accounts.

Director Nixon stated that this year, taxpayers will find two questions relating to such expenses on the Federal Income Tax return, Form 1040. These questions MUST be answered, cautioned the Director.

It was further pointed out that employees who are required to, and do account to their employers for reimbursed expenses, do not have to report these items on their returns.

Employees who do not account to their employers or who are not reimbursed for expenses MUST attach an itemized schedule of expenses incurred and any reimbursement received regardless of the net outcome.
