## David Eldridge ROTC Pilot Training Man

Completion of a contract with the U. S. Army for an expansion of ROTC training at Western Michigan University will include pilot training for selected advanced students.

Among them is David Eldridge, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. A. Eldridge, 1338 Holland, Birmingham. One of five students currently in this program, he is a senior in business administration, majoring in personnel administration. He graduated in 1958 from Birmingham High School.

UNDER THE agreement certain students will be permitted to enroll in the University's existing flight training program in its department of engineering and technology, taking their work at the University's facilities at the Kalamazoo Municipal Airport, including basic ground school and flight instruction.

Need Burning Permit

By law, landowners are required to get a burning permit at no cost from the Conservation Department before starting open fires. This requirement holds true on all lands and at all times when there is no snow on the ground. Persons who burn without a permit face a possible \$50 fine and/or 90-day jail sentence.

## Ordinance Dept Seeking Job Applicants

The U. S. Army Ordnance Tank-Automotive Command (OTAC) is seeking applicants for 14 professional positions which are in the \$8,240 to \$10,685 salary bracket.

T. P. Randolph, executive secretary of the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners at the Detroit Arsenal, 28251 Van Dyke Center Line, Michigan, is in charge of the recruiting drive for engineers and a patent advisor.

All of the positions require a college degree or its equivalent in professional experience and theoretical knowledge," Randolph said. "In addition applicants must have three years of professional experience in mechanical engineering, including one year of specializing in the automotive field."

THE POSITIONS are in offices at the Detroit Arsenal. The work will be connected intimately with OTAC's mission to develop and provide the best tracked and wheeled ground weapon systems to the U. S. Army and other Free World nations.

Randolph said positions starting at \$8,955 a year are open to a transport vehicle design engineer, five automotive design engineers, two trailer design engineers, a mechanical engineer specializing in automotive power plants, and two mechanical engineers with Ordnance experience in fire control systems.

A position paying a starting salary of \$10,025 is open for an engineer or physical scientist specializing in the field of patent and other proprietary rights.

There are also two openings in positions starting at \$8,240 a year for engineers with experience in heavy automotive suspension and running gear design and in automotive component design.
