CERN, a native of Dallas, Texas, has been engaged in the public practice of Christian Science for more than 25 years. He became interested in Christian Science when a young actor.

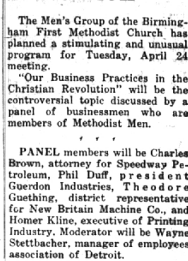
