## HARRY O. SMART K8UQ

How about a visit to a typical novice class, amateur radio station?

Let's go over to 238 Catalpa, Birmingham, and visit amateur radio station K8NSALF, owned and operated by Jack Thatcher.

Jack received his first novice license in June, 1961, and has been on the air ever since. Like many novices, his station is made up of used and war-surplus equipment.

His initial investment was around \$30.

THIS HASN'T SATISFIED him as a permanent situation, however, and he has plans to add to his radio equipment. His present set-up has enabled him to get on the air, to give him practice in sending and receiving, and to improve his code speed to the point where he will be able to take his examination for a general class license soon.

Jack's station is mounted on a small table and tucked into a corner of his basement. Various other equipment ranging from speakers to telegraph keys is scattered around.

His wife Ginny's pride is a home-made coil wrapped around an oatmeal box. Although the coil is no longer in use, no ham will ever throw anything out that "might come in handy."

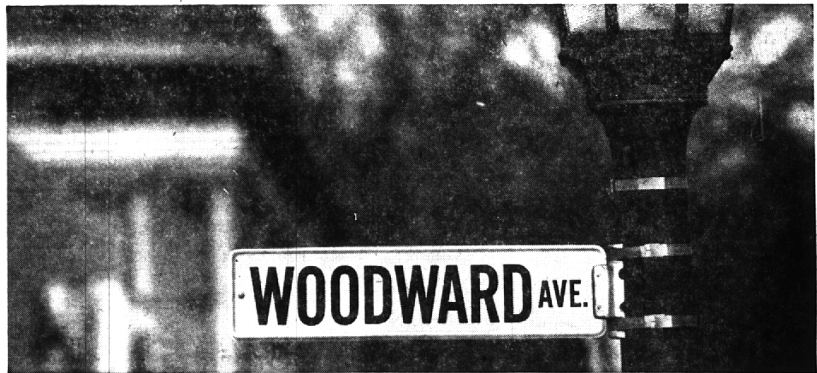
JACK IS LEARNING fast. A year ago, he was having a hard time receiving five words a minute. Now he can copy at 13 and 15.

A year ago, he didn't know the difference between a tube and a transformer. Now, he can figure the inductive reactance of a coil or determine the resonant frequency of a tuned circuit.

He has used the self-study method, with some help from other local hams, as well as various books and pamphlets. This is perhaps a typical, novice station.

IN HIS mid-40's, Jack has a job that requires none of the talents necessary to the ham operator, but he finds his newly acquired hobby relaxing, interesting and challenging. His goal, like all novices is to obtain that highly coveted general class license.

Such a transition from casual interest, to novice, to general class operator is a frequent occurrence among ham radio fans.
