HERB RECIPE OF THE WEEK: EASTER HAM IN WINE

1-4 to 5 lb. precooked ham, 1 T. minced parsley, 1 clove garlic minced fine, 1/2 teaspoon each of thyme & marjoram, 1/2 cup each of fresh, 1/2 cup ground cloves, 1/2 cup mustard, 3 T. brown sugar, 1/4 cup Tarragon Wine Vinegar, 1/2 cup white wine, 1 bay leaf, 1/2 cup parsley, garlic, herbs, cloves, mustard and sugar together, to smooth paste with the vinegar and rub over ham. Pour wine in bottom of pan, add bay leaf and bake in a moderate oven 3 1/2 hours, basting every 15 min. Skim excess fat from gravy and serve as a sauce.

**GM Subsidiary
To Produce Auto
In West Germany**

Adam Opel A.G., General Motors vehicle manufacturing subsidiary, will produce a new small car in plants nearing completion at Bochum, West Germany, it was announced today.

Dr. Hans Schnabel, Opel's general sales manager, disclosed that the vehicle will be a roomy, four-passenger car powered by a newly designed four-cylinder engine, water cooled and mounted in front. It will be called the Kadett, the name used for a small passenger car manufactured by Opel prior to World War II.

The new car, which has been under development for several years, will be in the one liter class, Dr. Schnabel said. Additional details will not be disclosed until the car is introduced to the European market later this year, he added.
