Council Defers Budget For Further Study

BINGHAM FARMS—The proposed fiscal budget and the replacement for resigning councilman Donald Morse were deferred Monday night when Bingham's council met with village President Pro-Tem Donald A. Johnston, Jr. Council accepted copies of the \$6,000 budget, submitted by Haskell Wright, council president, but agreed details needed clarification before official acceptance and publication. A special meeting will be held for this purpose upon Wright's return from a business trip.

IT IS EXPECTED that three mills will continue to be levied for the \$5,300 general highway fund.

with \$5,000 from state funds covering the road maintenance budget. The charter requires a public hearing date to be set before the board of review meets—on May 19, this year—when millage is levied above the state-set limit.

Although no successor was named for Morse, who is moving from the village this week, his responsibilities as street commissioner have been assigned to Johnston who reported that roads appear to be in "pretty good shape. He said further conferences with Morse would enable him to develop plans for the coming year.

COUNCILMAN Vern Vesper suggested village street signs be examined and replaced where needed.

Upon the request of Assessor David Stany, the village will investigate possibilities and county restrictions for securing signs "in keeping with the rustic character" of the community.

Village Marshall Charles Epker proposed that the extension of Timber Trail, presently named Hickory Hollow, be re-designated so that the road is named Timber Trail in its entirety. County road authorities will be consulted.

B'field Township Buys Fire Truck; To Cost \$21,857

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—There's no such thing as last-minute shopping for a fire engine—in fact, there'll be a year long wait before the township receives delivery of the fire truck which the township board agreed to purchase Monday night.

The latest in fire fighting equipment, it will pump 750 gallons per minute and have capacity to carry 1500 feet of hose. Cost is \$21,857.

The pumper will be housed at the new fire station, planned at Kendry and Franklin Roads. The station will be completed several months before the truck arrives and will be operated temporarily with equipment borrowed from other township fire stations.

Wilson Widow Willed Bulk Of His Estate

Bulk of the estate of the late Alfred G. Wilson who died April 6 in Scottsdale, Ariz., goes to his widow, Matilda R. Wilson. The will was filed in probate court recently and included bequests of \$15,000 to Mr. Wilson's daughter, Mrs. Thomas S. Eccles, and of \$10,000 to a son, Richard S. Wilson, both of Bloomfield Township.

Mrs. Wilson will receive an estimated \$100,000 and the personal property of her husband.

MR. WILSON also left \$10,000, each, to Beloit College and the Boy Scouts of America, and \$5,000 to the First Protestant Society of Detroit, and \$3,000 to University Presbyterian Church, Rochester.

Before his death Mr. Wilson and his wife gave MSUO a donation of \$2 million and their estate, Meadow Brook, at Rochester.

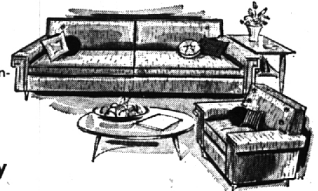
