Through train 21-17 will leave Detroit at 12:30 p.m. EST instead of 1:40 p.m. and will leave Milwaukee Junction at 12:40 p.m. A flag stop is made in Highland Park at 12:45 p.m., and the train will arrive in Royal Oak at 12:55 p.m., Birmingham at 1:01 p.m. and Pontiac at 1:15 p.m.

School Head Hails Budget Reform Bill

The separation of the county school districts' budget from that of the county in a bill passed by the State Senate was hailed by William J. Emerson, superintendent of the Oakland County School District, as a triumphal step to "put school things in a school place and county things in a county place."

Beginning in 1963 budget requests would be sent directly to the County Tax Allocation Board rather than being included in the over-all county budget requests.

Oakland County Polio Fund Tops '61 by \$11,000

An increase of over \$11,000 in its 1962 March of Dimes campaign was reported at the annual meeting of the Oakland County chapter. This brings the total amount raised to \$111,069.63 according to the Rev. G. Burton Hodgson, chapter chairman.

The campaign manager, Hal Newbauer, announced that returns from Lathrup, where the unit was headed by Mrs. David P. Anderson, was \$1,119.30; from Bloomfield Township, Mrs. Charles A. Bolter, chairman, \$5,133.41, and Birmingham, directed by Arthur J. Lake, \$9,600.04.

Barnum Jr. High Bows in Track, 63-29

Tom Marsh bettered the school shot put mark, but Barnum Junior High lost its opening dual track meet in the Little Oak League to Berkeley's Anderson, 63-29, last Wednesday.

Marsh, 5'10", 185 pounds, tossed the shot 44 feet 1 1/2 inches shattering the old record of 44 feet four inches.

BARNUM'S Bill Bowring won the 60-yard high hurdles in .9.8. Jeff Lucas took a first in the 75-yard dash in .8.8. Rich Schoenrock, who was second in the broad jump, was second in the 75. Greg Johnstone and Jim Olsen tied for second in the 100-yard dash in 1:11.5.

Other finishers for Barnum were: Mark Richards, third in pole vault; Jim Thompson, second in high jump; Bill Owen, third in the 100-yard low hurdles.

Secretary of State James M. Hare has asked 300 branch managers of the Michigan Department of State to assist political hopefuls of all parties by notarizing their primary petitions without charge.

"It appears that we will have many more primary candidates for legislative and other State offices this year than we have in other recent election years," Hare said.

The deadline for filing petitions for Governor, Lt. Governor, Representative in the U.S. Congress, and for State Senators and Representatives in the State Legislature is 4 p.m. Tuesday, June 19. The primary election will be held on Tuesday, Aug. 7.
