The Spring Rummage Sale scheduled for Thursday, May 3, is one of two sales held annually by the Episcopal Church Women of Christ Church Cranbrook for the purpose of raising funds which are used in five fields of service.

THE EXCHANGE of letters and pictures with the orphaned children, the caring for their clothing, educational, medical and other needs, as well as remembering them on their birthdays and at Christmas, has generated enthusiasm resulting in private financing by at least one of the members.

The church women met Tuesday to continue preparations for the sale. A fashion show during the luncheon gave members a preview of some of the clothes donated to the sale.

IN SERVICE to the community, the fund contributes to Oakland County Institutions and agencies such as Pontiac State Hospital, Oakland County Medical Care Facility, Big Brothers of Oakland County, Family Service, Camp Chikamagi for boys, Holiday House, camp for girls, and the Birmingham Community House.

Funds are provided for the care of four Korean orphans in service to the nation and the world. This is accomplished through Foster Parents Plan, Inc., rescuing and caring for children who have been starving, cold, dressed in rags, and often living in the streets.

BEVERLY HILLS - Plans for the new Beverly Hills Methodist Church were submitted Monday, April 16, to the village council for approval. The church group expects to break ground for the contemporary new building near the northeast corner of 13 Mile Road and Evergreen, on June 3.

The main part of the proposed structure, 40 x 80 feet, will be built first at an estimated \$135,000 for the building, \$140,000 furnished. The finished church will cost between \$600,000 and \$700,000.

The oval-shaped church will have a 14-foot-high tower with stained glass panels above the entrance which will be 16 feet high. An aluminate cross will top the tower.
