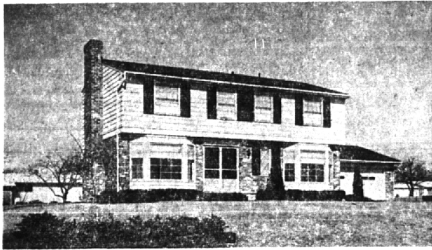


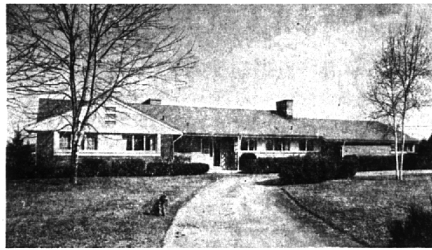

Library Sponsors Book Vote

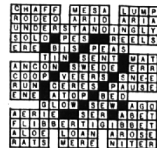
Birmingham children will be offered a chance to become temporary book critics in the next two weeks by the Baldwin Public Library.

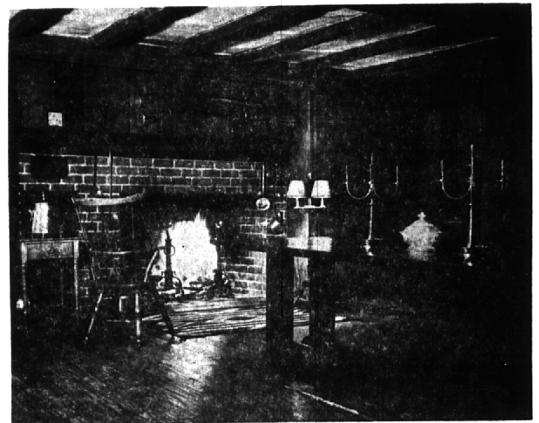
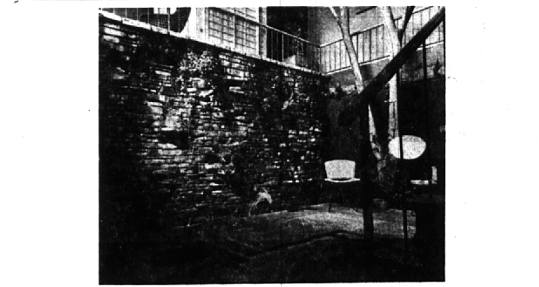
