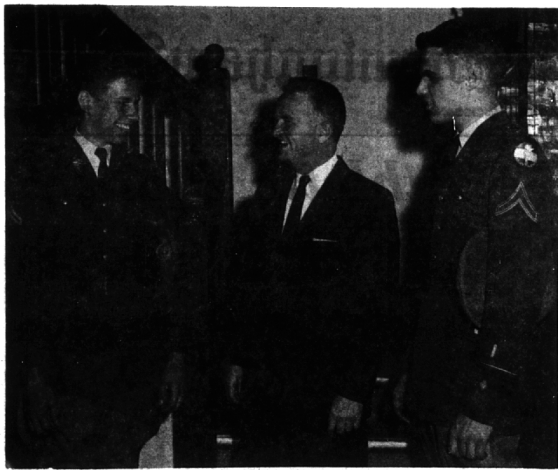
## B'field Open Hunt Teams Win Over Guest Culver

A capacity crowd of 400 turned out at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Saturday night to watch the Lanier Platoon of the famous Black Horse Troop of Culver Military Academy put on their colorful close order drill.

The drill, which is climaxed with a thrilling jump through a hoop of fire, was followed by a jumping competition with BOH riders—two rounds over ten fences and two chukkers of polo between the Culver and Bloomfield Open Hunt teams. BOH won the jumping competition by a close margin, and the hard-fought polo match ended with the Bloomfield Open Hunt in front at 8 to 5.

THE CULVER cadets on their matched black chargers put on an excellent demonstration of horsemanship, and the enthusiastic crowd gave them a rousing ovation at the conclusion. All of the events were held in the inside ring of the BOH; and Colonels William Robinette and Gerald J. Graham, in charge of the group, complimented the club management on the excellent facilities and arrangements.

## Barons Undefeated In Baseball, Track

Cecil Morgan, Bloomfield Hills High baseball coach, is more relaxed after watching his club continue its winning ways.

The unbeaten Barons bumped West Bloomfield, 8-3, last Thursday and despite four regulars being away on vacation trips Morgan's team whipped previous undefeated Milford, 8-1, Monday.

JOHN AUGUSTIN, 5'11", 160-pound righthander, picked up both victories to raise his record to four straight wins. He hasn't allowed a single earned run this season. Against West Bloomfield, Augustin fanned 12 and gave up one hit in six innings. He turned in another six-inning stint Monday as he struck out eight and stymied Milford on two hits.

The Barons supported Augustin by hitting two West Bloomfield batters for 15 hits featuring four doubles and a triple. Marshall Sherba continued his lusty hitting connecting for four safeties.

Bill Bennett, Frank Heidefelder and Brian O'Neil added two hits apiece. Ed Eliason was tagged with the loss.

O'Neil, catcher, Bill Pettibone, first baseman, Rick Fricke, second sacker and Dick Janz, infielder, weren't present Monday as the Barons tripped Milford.

MORGAN'S crew was sparked by the timely hitting of Gary Garwood, who slugged a triple, single and double and drove in four runs.

The Barons got off to a fast start in the third inning when Sherza singled—he has some hits in 13 trips so far—and came home on shortstop Bill Bennett's 380-foot home run.

The Barons tallied two more in the fourth on Augustin's single, a passed ball, a sacrifice, Garwood's triple and an error.

GARWOOD'S base-clearing double and Kyle Kerhway's rambunctious single featured a four-run fifth inning outburst.

"Our hitting has been tremendous," echoed a jubilant Morgan. "But our big test is today at Northville, defending Wayne-Oakland champion."

ART TREGENZA and John Schweppe combined for 29 1/2 points last Tuesday as the undefeated Barons streaked to their second triangular triumph and third victory.

Coach Don Hoff's thinclads

amassed 84 1/2 points, Berkeley 40 1/2 and Oak Park 12.

Tregenza was in rare form as he claimed firsts in the broad jump with a 18'7 1/2" leap and the high and low hurdles and ended up in a three-way deadlock for first in the high jump for 18 points.

SCHWEPPE captured both the 100 and 220 yard dashes with 1:07.7 and 2:39.9 clockings, respectively, and ran as a member of the victorious 880-yard relay team.

The Barons took 11 first places as they continued to display their awesome might. The defending Wayne-Oakland titleholders resume the season in a triangular meet Tuesday against Milford and Walled Lake at Walled Lake.
