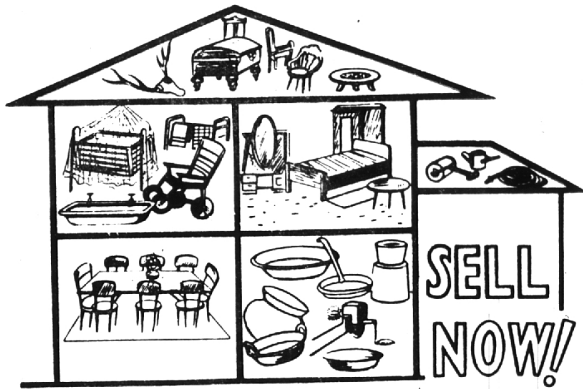


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Report County Ready To Drop Jetport Plan

Reports circulated throughout Oakland County this week that the board of supervisors would abandon the idea of building a jet airport on its land northeast of Pontiac.

A member of the supervisors' aviation committee, who asked that he not be named, expressed the possibility of abandoning the project after an airline announcement that the commercial carriers were "not interested" in a second major airport in the metropolitan area.

The commercial airlines, operating out of Metropolitan and Willow Run airports informed county officials by letter that they have no desire to plan for even a portion of their operations at any other existing or proposed airport.

SOME SUPERVISORS were reported as being bitter over the airlines' letter, feeling that the county had been "taken for a ride."

Another supervisor said he wondered why the airlines had remained silent in the matter so long. A third said that experts had led county officials to believe another airport was needed and "the county

The letter was signed by William A. Glassford, special assistant to the president of United Airlines, and Jack A. Tompkins, regional vice president of American Airlines.

are mental patients at Ionia State Hospital.

The two men, James G. Styes, 37, of Clark, and John T. Auld, 42, of Toledo, are presently held in maximum security at Ionia.

According to Assistant County Prosecutor Richard Condit, the attorney general's office had asked the high court last September to reverse a county circuit court ruling declaring Styes and Auld sane and able to stand trial.

AN APPEAL was filed, Condit said, but no action has been taken by the state office to further it. The attorney general at the time the appeal was filed was Paul I. Adams.

According to Condit, the county believes it has jurisdiction in the case because the crime was committed within the county. The state, however, claims the two men are wards of the state, Condit said.
