

National Guard Chaplain Studies Indoctrination

The Rev. Carl R. Sayers, of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, is currently attending the United States Army chaplain school at Ft. Slocum, N. Y.

Fr. Sayers is chaplain of the 1st Missile Bn. 17th Artillery, Michigan Army National Guard. He is completing phase three of the indoctrination course in the school, which is located on an island near the center of New Rochelle, N. Y.

The Chaplain School serves ordered clergy members of all faiths, Protestant, Roman Catholic and Jewish. The continental course in 1975 gave official standing to the chaplaincy.

THE NUMBER of chaplains increased from that time until World War II, when 8000 chaplains served their country. Today, chaplains serve both full time with the active army and part time with the national guard and the army reserves. The extensive educational program of the school is designed to develop leadership qualities of chaplains so that they may become capable and effective in making religion and morality a living force in the total life of the military establishment and in the individual lives of persons.

THE TRAINING also shows chaplains how to develop effective religious and moral educational programs within the framework of the Army.
