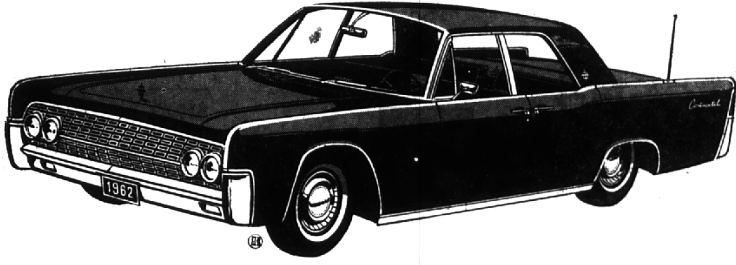
The program calls for instruction each morning, an intra-squad game in the afternoon and a game with an outside team every night.
