Falling Stars Are in Season Says Expert

Falling stars are now in season. They may catch a glimpse of our skies at a higher rate than at any other time of the year. They will be at the peak period, says University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Losh.

A blazing meteor looks as bright when it plunges into the earth's atmosphere, and the resulting fire-

balls sets them burning. Most meteors never reach the earth. "Although they may appear in any part of the sky, their paths, when traced back, seem to intersect in the northeast, where the constellation of Perseus rises around 10 p.m.," says Professor Losh. "Hence they are called Perseid meteors."

"This year, however, the moon, full on Aug. 15, will interfere somewhat with observations of the Perseid meteors," Professor Losh notes. Few Perseids will appear before midnight, the number increasing sharply toward dawn.

"Today we know that comets and meteors are related," Professor Losh says. "What created comets is not known, but because there are comets we have meteors."
