Nativity Fund Sets \$50,000 Building Goal

Nativity Episcopal Churchwomen will sponsor a theater party at Northland Playhouse for the popular musical "Eye, Bye, Birdie" Aug. 23. Proceeds will go to the building fund for the new Nativity Church.

Nativity Church, a mission of Christ Church, Cranbrook, was established in early 1957. In August of that year the property at 21220 W. 11 Mile Road, Bloomfield Township, was purchased, and services have been held since then in the house which occupied the property.

THE REV. Louis C. Gillette became the first vicar of Nativity in June, 1958, after graduation from Virginia Theological Seminary, Alexandria, Virginia, and has continued in that capacity.

In February, 1962, the ever-increasing parish of Nativity voted to construct a new church. Thus far approximately \$20,000 has been pledged of the \$40,000 needed to begin the first unit of the new church.

THIS BUILDING will contain office facilities, a small kitchen and a parish hall to be used for services. The present building is to be made into classrooms for the children. The main body of the church will be built in two years.
