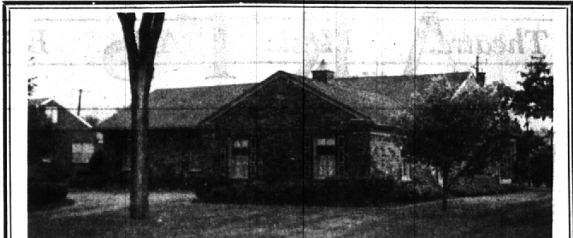
BUT HAS SUCCESS spoiled Marvin?

MSUO to Offer Chinese Class

Chinese language will be taught at Michigan State University Oakland beginning this September.

Dr. Charles O. Hucker, professor of history and chairman of MSUO's committee on Asian studies, will teach the course. He will emphasize spoken and written modern Mandarin Chinese, the official language for the last 40 years of both Nationalist China and Red China.

This course complements MSUO's pioneer program which requires all students to take a one-year sequence of non-Western area studies in addition to a one-year study of Western cultures. MSUO is the only institution in the nation which requires both of these.

Hucker came to MSUO from the University of Arizona, where he taught Oriental studies. Prior to that, he was at the University of Chicago.

He has been departmental editor for Oriental literature for the Encyclopedia Britannica since 1955. Hucker is the author of "The Traditional Chinese State in Ming Times (1368-1644)," which is the first story for the general reader of one of mankind's most remarkable and durable creations—China's Imperial System of government.

His "China: A Critical Bibliography," which lists by topic more than 2,200 books, articles and chapters of books which are valuable in the study of China, was also published this year.
