Radio Station Names Resident Program Director

Norman B. Cleary, former Assistant Professor, Science of Society Department, Montclair College, Wayne State University, has named the staff of station WDTM (106.7 FM) as Director of Programming.

In his new position, Cleary, of 415 Merrill, Birmingham, will be responsible for WDTM's programming of classical, concert, folk, jazz and show music, and will direct the further development of entertainment productions for WDTM and the Taliesin Station, the midwest's first FM-only group.

Since May, Cleary has been host for the station's "WDTM Saturday Night" (10 p.m.-12:30 a.m.). During August, he will be heard in two new programs: "Wisdom of the Orient," a program of music and spoken word delving into the unusual of the Orient and "Turning Leaves," readings from literature.

FROM 1959 to the present, Cleary has been a staff member of the national government's International Cooperation Administration communications seminars held throughout the country for foreign professional personnel brought to this country under the ICA program.

At Montclair College, Cleary has taught Integrated Social Science, Communication Theory & Process, and Sociology of Art. In 1961, he was a staff member of Detroit Adventure - Conversations in the Arts. Cleary came to Detroit from East Lansing, where he was an instructor in the Communications Arts Department, Michigan State University.

He received his B.S. and M.S. degrees from Iowa State University and has completed the major portion of his work toward the Ph.D. in Communication and Social Psychology at Michigan State University.

The author thought that they seemed to prefer this method of communication to the spoken word. All the pygmies are short, stocky and very timid. Their average height is about an inch under four feet, and their average weight is about 75 pounds.
