People Park Longer Now, Report Shows

People are parking longer in Birmingham. Chief of Police Ralph W. Moxley informed the city commission Monday night.

Moxley reported on the quarterly parking meter survey taken during the week of July 21-27.

The report showed an increase in revenue over the July 1961, survey in all meter zones except the 30-minute spots.

Revenues, however, dropped slightly when compared to April, 1962. Moxley pointed out that the drop was due to the usual summer lull.

THE BIGGEST increases over 1961 were in the one and two-hour meter zones. One-hour revenue rose from \$827 to \$850, while two-hour collections were upped from \$414 to \$469.

Moxley said with the increase expected in the coming seasonal shopping parking demand it will probably be necessary to increase two-hour parking spaces in Municipal Lot No. 2.

Ford Tractor Reorganizes; Personnel Changes Made

Appointment of F. A. Wagoner as manager of Ford Motor Co.'s tractor plant at Highland Park, is announced by R. E. Hunt, general manufacturing manager, Ford Tractor Division. Wagoner succeeds C. M. Rhoten, who has retired.

Wagoner of 18236 Greenwald, Southfield, has been manager, plant engineering department, at the Highland Park plant since Oct., 1958.

He joined Ford in 1928 at the Rouge Plant, Dearborn, and became a foreman in 1936. During World War II, he was in charge of aircraft gear machining, and in 1945 was assigned to the Tractor Plant as general foreman in charge of tractor gears. From 1950 to 1954, he was production manager of Rochester Gear Co., Goodrich, Mich., and returned to Highland Park to become superintendent of gear manufacturing. He was appointed general plant superintendent in May, 1953, and became production manager in January, 1958.

The new departmental managers are: T. A. Brown as personnel administration and services manager; T. F. Brown as hourly personnel and labor relations manager; and Gordon Marshall as organization and administration manager.

Hallock, 6915 Halvard, Birmingham, joined Ford in 1947 with the Lincoln-Mercury Division. He held various administrative, purchasing and product planning positions prior to 1961, when he was named administration manager in the company's former Ford Tractor Operations.

He became associated with the former Tractor and Implement Division in February, 1959, as industrial relations manager.

Brown became associated with Ford in 1950 at the Chicago Aircraft Engine Division. In 1961 he became supervisor of employee services, labor relations and hourly personnel for the former Tractor and Implement Division.

Marshall, who joined Ford in 1939, has been the Division's organization planning manager since September, 1961. He previously served as an organization analyst for Lincoln-Mercury Division, manager of the former Edsel Division's organization and systems department, and as an administrative assistant in the Office of the President. He lives at 5550 Forman Dr., Bloomfield Township.

O'Donnell also joined Ford in 1953 after service with Dearborn Motors Corp., and had since 1958, served as a section supervisor of tractor chassis design.
