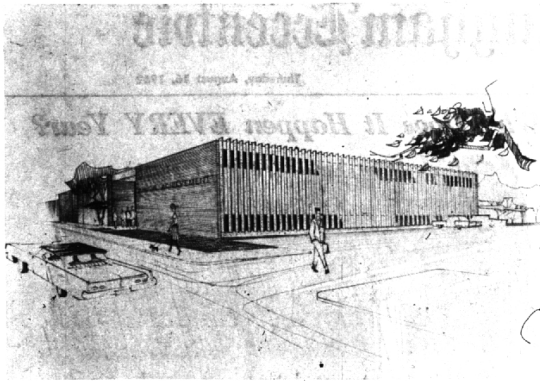

New Junior Achievement Center

Architect's sketch shows the new Junior Achievement Business Center now under construction at Woodward and 13 1/2 Mile Road, Royal Oak. The 8,500 square foot multi-level building will serve as base of operations for an estimated 1400-1600 Achievers from Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Farmington, Berkeley, Clawson, Madison Heights, Hazel Park, Oak Park, Royal Oak and Huntington Woods. Featuring concrete, brick, and glass, the new building will be the second largest Junior Achievement Business Center in the nation. It is scheduled for completion by October 1 in time for JA's '62-'63 program year. Architects for the building were Tarapata-MacMahon Associates, Inc., of Bloomfield Hills.

Veteran Pilot Retires from State Police

State Police Sgt. Bert O. Froberg, case supervisor at East Lansing headquarters and the department's first regularly assigned pilot, is retiring Aug. 17 after 25 years of service.

Froberg began his State Police pilot duties in Oct., 1947, after the department purchased its own plane, and was officially assigned February 1, 1948 to the East Lansing post for flying duties. He had obtained a private flying license in 1939.

During 12 years as a State Police pilot Froberg logged close to 5,000 hours flying time on a variety of missions. He was transferred Aug. 2, 1959 to the records and statistics division at East Lansing headquarters as a case supervisor in the recent reorganization.

Froberg joined the State Police in 1937 and served at Detroit, Paw Paw, Manistee, Alpena and Battle Creek before being transferred in 1948 to East Lansing. He has three citations for meritorious service.

He was born May 27, 1914 at Gladstone where he graduated from high school and later attended Michigan College of Mining and Technology at Houghton for a year. Upon his retirement, he and his family will move to Alpena.

Abolish My Job!

"A public office that requires no work, pays no salary and demands no time, has no problems and should not exist." That's what Oakland County surveyor Ralph A. Main says of his job. He thinks it should be abolished. Main, a Birmingham city commissioner and former mayor, was renominated by Republicans for the county surveyor's post in last week's primary. "It's a statutory job," he said. "Nothing is required." He has been surveyor since Jan. 1, 1957. Why did he run in the first place? "If nobody from our party ran, then the other party would be holding an office." MAIN SAYS there is "nothing mandatory" about the job and it "should be taken out. I'm going to work to have it removed completely." Main is an engineer by profession.

Federal Official Praises Michigan Highway Program

Michigan is one of the nation's leading road building states because it is putting its federal highway funds to work at a much faster rate than most other states, a federal official said last week. "Our records show that excellent progress is being made by Michigan in advancing both the Interstate and primary-secondary-urban (ARS) highway programs," Deputy Federal Highway Administrator D. Grant Mickle said.

Mickle, in a letter to State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie, said Michigan has already obligated 73 per cent of its interstate fund for the fiscal year ending next June 30 compared to the national average of 50 per cent. At the same time, it has obligated 50 per cent of its primary, urban and secondary funds for the next fiscal year compared to 25 per cent for the country as a whole.

"MICHIGAN RANKS third among the states in the use of Interstate funds for the primary and secondary in the use of primary, urban and secondary appropriations," Mickle said.

Mackie said Michigan has consistently been among the leading states in utilization of Interstate fund allocations during the last five years. "This is evidence of the Highway Department's policy of converting gasoline taxes paid by highway users into highway improvements as rapidly as is consistent with sound planning and engineering," Mickle said.

Mickle said Michigan is one of three states building Interstate highways in advance of federal fund appropriations. "Projects totaling nearly \$47 million have been authorized in Michigan under the provisions of Federal highway legislation where by Interstate projects may be financed."
