HAM SHACK

How much of one's time does it take to enjoy amateur radio?

This is one of those frequently asked questions and, like many, it is a little hard to give a straightforward answer. There is no answer to the question other than to say that it is very flexible.

The amount of time varies with each ham. Like most hobbies it can be carried to extremes—this is, in fact, the view many people take. They have a mental picture of the typical ham as a person who spends every waking hour either on the air or building equipment in his workshop to the complete abandonment of all else.

THIS MAY be a true picture of some hams, but it is not typical. One reason amateur radio is so popular as a hobby is because the amount of time spent is so completely flexible. It is possible to spend an hour a month or several hours a day. Busy professional and businessmen cannot spend a great deal of time on their hobby unless perhaps they operate mobile equipment in their cars to help them pass the many hours they spend on the road.

Today, many mobile stations are being operated from private airplanes and boats.

FOR THE disabled or retired person who has too much time on his hands, amateur radio can be a marvelous outlet. No great amount of physical effort is required.

A story was recently circulated about a teenage youngster who was completely paralyzed from the neck down. He is able to work his station almost daily even though he spends all of his time in an iron lung.

HIS EQUIPMENT has been specially made for him by friendly hams in his area so that he can control his set by means of a wooden paddle held in his teeth. Although this lad has difficulty in speaking, he can communicate with fellow hams all over the world by means of Morse code and a wooden paddle!

Many of us who are perfectly normal physically have trouble sending and receiving Morse code properly with our wrists.

THEN THERE ARE those frustrated hams who normally cannot spend any time at the hobby during the year.

For them there is the summer camp especially built and equipped so that they may "get away from it all" for a couple of weeks and "ham it up" until either their voice gives out or their wrists go stiff.

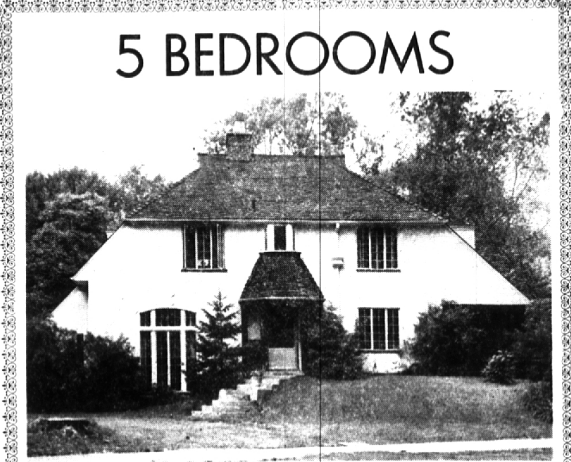
Some people feel that one must be pretty far gone to go to this extreme, but then there are places similar to this for the golfer, the swimmer and the skier, so why not the ham?

For the small fry operator, many of the boys' summer camps now have stations installed which serve a dual purpose: they teach some of the fundamentals of radio while helping the kids keep track of their parents back home.

University Women Hold Their Own

Women have proved they could hold their own in American colleges and universities, a U.S. Department of Agriculture home economist has told nearly 1,000 Michigan homemakers.

Speaking at "College Week for Women," 35 annual homemakers' conference at Michigan State University recently, Eunice Heywood said, "The pleas for more women students to enter scientific professions give striking evidence of the distance women and the colleges have traveled in the past 100 years."

Miss Heywood, director of home economics programs for the Federal Extension Service of the U.S.D.A., emphasized the advances of higher education for women during the past 100 years. This year marks the centennial of the legislation that established land-grant colleges in the United States.

Miss Heywood asserted that it is largely because of the land-grant movement, which stresses education for the common people, that women are now an accepted part of higher education.
