'Rich' English

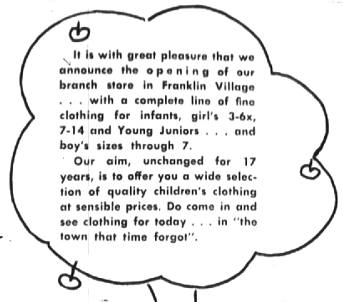
