and "flying bugs" with strings.
- If the wisteria vines have not bloomed, try a bit of ROOT PRUNING. It is often successful.
 - The COLCHICUM BULB does NOT look like a mashed potato. It really looks—well, it is a mysterious bulb which grows indoors without soil or water and outdoors with both. A PERFECT GIFT FOR A "SHUT-IN." (Hospital nurses love them because they require no care at all.)
 - Pick GOURDS for winter decorations BEFORE the first frost. Leave 2" of stem and bring into house to dry.
 - Permit squashes & pumpkins to ripen thoroughly before harvesting. They will keep better. Store in warm place.
 - Early pears should be picked one week before they become soft (?). Store in cool dark place to ripen.
 - Grapes do not ripen after picking. If you are making wine be sure to remove shoots and socks before mashing the grapes.
 - Apples are ready for picking when the green ground coloring disappears and the fruit separates from the spurs when rotated.
 - HORNETS & other stinging insects in this class are easily controlled or eliminated with the JET HORNET aerosol bomb.
 - Prune ornamental trees now to keep them shapely this winter. But DON'T PRUNE TOO HARD until leaves have fallen.

hole medal play. They are Arnold Palmer, 1952 British Open and Masters champion, Jack Nicklaus, 1962 National Open champion, and Gary Player, PGA champion, \$80,000, richest single purse in golf, goes to the winner. Second prize is \$15,000. \$10,000 goes to the third place finisher.

The last six holes of each day's 18-hole play will be telecast from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m., EDT.

The tough Kirostone Course in Akron is a familiar layout for all three golfers. Palmer won the American Golf Classic there in early August this year with a 276 four-under-par total for 72 holes. This includes four birdies on the 625-yard 16th hole, which Palmer calls "the monster."

THE 16TH at Akron is also the hole where Palmer scored an 8 that cost him victory in the PGA tournament in 1960.

Palmer's 1962 win in the American Golf Classic brought him total earnings to \$80,198, surpassing the mark of \$75,250 established two years ago. Since 1947, he has won \$1,248,800 in money in golf prizes against any other man.

Jack Nicklaus has collected \$52,000 this year. Gary Player has won \$42,288.

The Professional Golf Association will supervise the match.

Higgins Lake Plans Trout Spawning Reef

Work was completed early this month on a community conservation project which may set the stage for natural lake trout reproduction in Higgins Lake, Roscommon county.

The project is a new spawning reef for lake trout located about one mile out from the lake's west shore. It measures about 100 feet in length and twice the width of a football field in an area where the fish are known to concentrate during the fall spawning season.

Selection of the project site was also pinpointed by Conservation Department studies which showed this area is free of siltation and has suitable water temperatures and currents for egg hatching.

SOME 200 yards of broken concrete were hauled on barges and dumped in the area by Department fisheries workers to create the artificial spawning bar. Material for the project was stockpiled at the lake shore earlier this year by District 14 of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

Lake trout are expected to place their spawn in crevices of concrete chunks where the eggs will be protected from predation by perch and mud puppies.

A SKIN-DIVING fisheries biologist will check the reef for eggs in early November during the fall spawning season. Plans also call for placing some lenses of lake trout eggs in the area to study hatching results.

Department fisheries officials expect it will take several years before they can judge the project's results and the possibilities it may offer for other lakes where there is no known natural reproduction of lake trout.

Deer Permit Forms Available Soon

Application cards for antlerless deer hunting permits should be available at Michigan's hunting and fishing license dealers in mid-September, the Conservation Department announces.

Copies of the 1962 deer hunting guide will be mailed with the cards, showing special season areas, kill quotas, and the step-by-step procedure for filling out applications.

IN ANSWER to recent inquiries the Department points out that permits will not be issued on a "first come, first served" basis.

As in the past, a drawing will be held in late October to determine successful applicants for those areas in which applications outnumber permit quotas.

Upwards of 200,000 hunters are expected to apply for permits.
