Lazy Cowbird Doesn't Even Build Own Nest

Walloon Lake: The laziest member of all our avi-fauna is the cowbird.

As we were standing on the back porch of our cottage we saw a small woods warbler feeding a young cowbird about four times its size. This unusual procedure is typical of both birds.

The young cowbird had just left the nest. It was colored dark olive-brown above scaled with pale buff and dull white below streaked with brown.

While other industrious birds are working long hours making their nests, the cowbird is a silent and watchful. When the nests of such birds as vireos, warblers, sparrows and flycatchers are completed, this lazy member of the family is watching her opportunity, lay a single egg in another bird's nest.

THE EGGS OF the cowbird are five in number and are speckled with brown. If deposited in the nest of a robin or cardinal they are punctured and thrown out.

The moment the yellow warbler sees the unwanted egg she gets busy and builds a new nest below covering up her own eggs as well as those of the offending visitor. But the lazy cowbird may return and lay another egg in the new spot.

There are records of yellow warblers' nests, showing as many as five false bottoms. Careful but not too close to 100 birds are victimized by this clever impostor.

BECAUSE the cowbird's egg has a short 10-day incubation period, it is first of the clutch to hatch. The young impostor often throws out the remaining eggs. Even if the rightful young hatch the cowbird young are so large and strong that they crowd out the other fledglings or at least consume more than their share of the food.

The cowbird is a member of the blackbird family. Its name comes from the fact that it is frequently seen in pastures following a herd of cows. Here it finds such insects as grasshoppers and leaf hoppers stirred up by the cattle.

SOMETIMES they are seen on the back of a cow where they find mosquitoes and flies. They also eat the seeds of weeds and grasses.

Originally this species followed the great herds of bison of the prairies of the midwest, where it was known as the "buffalo" bird.

VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 62

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 28 ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE STATING FORTH THE REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW SUBDIVISIONS TO BE FOLLOWED; SETTING FORTH DESIGNS AND STANDARDS; PROVIDING FOR SPECIFICATIONS; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordains:

Section 1.01. That sub-paragraph C of Section 6.01, of Ordinance No. 62 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6.01.
C. A tangent of at least one hundred (100) feet shall be provided between reverse curves on collector and arterial streets.

All streets intersecting a major street shall do so with a tangent section of the center line not less than fifty (50) feet in length measured from the nearest right of way line of the major street.

Section 2.01. The provision of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and are hereby ordered to take immediate effect and be in full force upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, Michigan, this 20th day of August, A.D., 1962.
