New Teachers, Administrators Ready for Start of Semester

One hundred and fourteen new teachers and three new administrators will be in Birmingham's public school system when the fall semester starts Sept. 6.

The largest single number of new teachers at any one school will be at Wylie E. Groves High School where 20 new teachers will instruct.

Nine of these have out-of-state college degrees from such distant states as North Carolina, Iowa and Massachusetts. Others are from

Ohio, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin and Indiana.

THOSE FROM Michigan colleges and universities are Mrs. Betty Chesna, Miss Ann Eisall, Max Gozesky, William Lyman, Mrs. Elizabeth MacAdam, David Martenson, Roger Mattson, Ralph Nutter III, Miss Katherine Steffek, Miss Sandra Whitaker and Miss Judith Woods.

Out-of-staters with masters degrees are Mrs. Geraldine Frank, Miss Barbara Sanborn, Gerard Schwach and Mrs. Letitia Stott.

Seaholm High School is second to Groves in the number of new teachers. Seaholm will have 12; seven from this state.

Three of the seven, Miss Susan Dhooge, Miss Barbara Hyle and Miss Marjorie Shannon, are beginning teachers.

THOSE WITH masters degrees are Mrs. Virginia Beaman, University of Minnesota; Walter Mattis, Eastern Michigan University; and Merle Smith, Western Michigan University.

Teachers with degrees from out-of-state universities come from Minnesota, Alabama, Indiana, and Pennsylvania.

With 10 new teachers, Barnum Junior High School is just a step behind Seaholm. Of the 10, three—Miss Gerriett Harrington, Miss Nancy Logan and Mrs. Etta Sharon—are beginning teachers.

Two men—William Fiedo and James Smoht—have their master degrees. Fiedo received his from Michigan State and Smoht's came from Wayne State.

THE REMAINING breakdown of schools and the number of new teachers they will have this fall is as follows:

Alabama, 1; Baldwin, 6; Beverly, 1; Bloomfield Village, 1; Franklin, 1; Greenfield, 3; Harbin, 7; Meadow Lake, 6; Midvale, 1; Pembroke, 5; Pierce, 1; Torry, 1; Valley Woods, 2; Walnut Lake, 1; and Westchester, 7.

There will be seven new helping teachers and two special services teachers. Five of the nine are men. New personnel in the administrative offices are Mrs. Louise Coe, MA from Wayne State; Harry Jones, MA from Wayne State; and Richard Mossingill, MA from Indiana University.

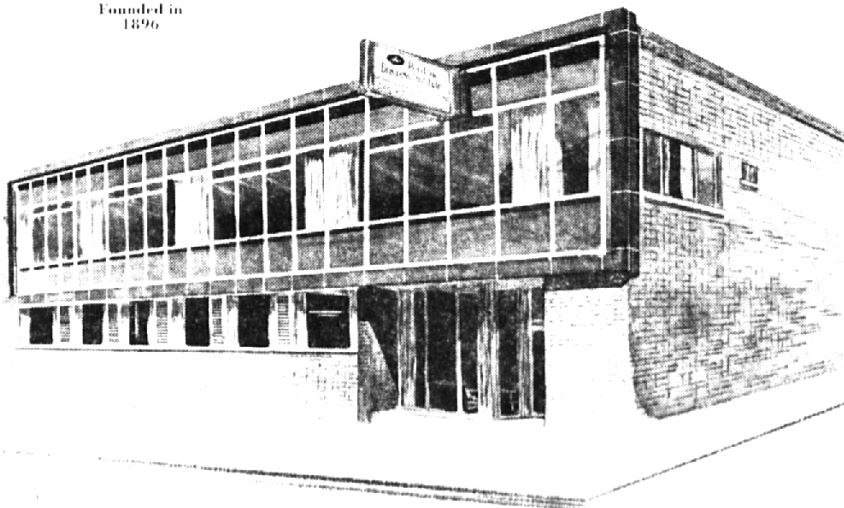
