Patti had left on June 28 from the U.S. to join her relatives in Adignon, France.

UPON REACHING Zernatt, Patti wrote a letter home saying that soon she and her cousins, Ariane and Arnard, were going walking in the Matterhorn mountains and that she would write more about that later.

The second letter was never written because, while walking, Patti became separated from her cousins. While trying to find her way back she slipped, fell and crashed down on a rocky ledge, fracturing her skull.

When Ariane and Arnard couldn't find Patti, they rushed back to Zernatt for help. A small searching party was formed and three hours later Patti was found.

"WE MADE telephone calls to our relatives in France and to the Swiss doctor who was caring for Patti," Mrs. Robert Wyatt—Patti's mother—said. "We weren't sure what condition she was in so I flew to Switzerland to see her."

Patti's recovery was fast but due to the nature of her injury she was hospitalized for one month. This didn't ruin her summer, though, for she developed many pen-pals and she had many visitors, including several touring college students from California.

"WHILE SHE was in the hospital, Patti was in good humor and she had fun trying to communicate with the nurses," Mrs. Wyatt said. "Patti had had two years of French in school but most of the nurses spoke only German. Therefore, they used sign language and such international words as 'Twist' to communicate.

"They got along fine."

What impressed Patti the most about Europe was the friendliness of the people, the cooking, the speed-crazy driving habits and easy-going way of life.

PERHAPS PATTI was impressed by the casual way-of-life of the Europeans, but once she returned to the U.S. she stepped back into the rush-rush pattern of American life.


She was home less than 24 hours when she was off again, this time to Flint to visit her grandparents. Before leaving, however, Patti said:

"When I return I hope that I don't hear another word about my Switzerland trip. I loved it but it's over. Now I want to hear what my friends did this summer."

She'll have that opportunity once school starts at Seaholm Sept. 6 and she begins her senior year. Patti lives with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Wyatt, 231 S. Glenhurst, Birmingham.

Interviewing has begun on the follow-up community survey, according to Birmingham School Superintendent Otis M. Dickey. Financed by a \$30,000 grant through Eastern Michigan University by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, the research project will measure the extent of community support for schools and determine the factors that have some influence on the degree of support.

"THE EXCELLENT cooperation of the residents in the 1961 survey resulted in a most successful study," commented Rashid Bashshur, director of the current study. "It was most significant in securing the grant which will enable the school district and schools at large to profit from better educational planning."

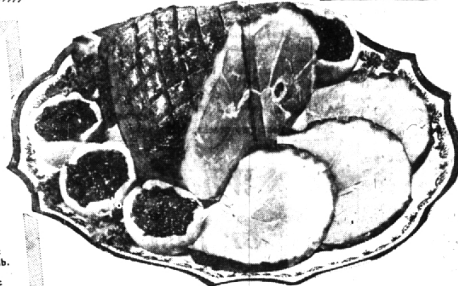
