

Legal Question Blocks Vote on Oakland College

A November vote on the establishment of an Oakland County community college has been blocked by a legal technicality.

Supporters of the proposal had planned to place the issue and a plan seek a \$1 tax increase on the fall ballot.

The setback stems from the failure of the State Attorney General's office to hand down an opinion in time according to a county board of education official.

AN OPINION was sought to clarify whether a section of the

Clareville School District in southwestern Oakland County could be excluded from the vote.

The district is partly in Wayne County and is included in the Northwest Wayne County Community College District.

The Oakland County Community College Advisory Council hopes to have the proposal on the ballot for the spring election next April. A projected 1964-65 deadline for the opening of the college is hoped for.

Candidate Urges Formation of Suburb Caucus

A Democratic candidate for state legislature has called for the formation of "suburb" caucuses in state politics.

Harold J. Robinson has urged that a "third force—bipartisan—suburban caucus be established.

Robinson told the Royal Oak Democratic Club last week that at present suburban communities are in a "no-man's land," neither having the interests of a big city or an agricultural area.

He pointed out that there are more people living in the suburbs than in large cities or farm areas.

An office seeker in the fifth district, Robinson told the group that the formation of a suburban caucus in the House would provide suburban representatives with a framework within which to operate for the benefit of their communities.

He added that the caucus should be bipartisan because the needs of the suburbs cross party lines.

Troy will receive a \$37,105 Federal grant to aid in its comprehensive planning program, it was announced last week by the Urban Renewal Administration.

Troy was one of 10 communities to receive grants under the Urban Planning Assistance Program.

The grant will help provide studies of natural resources, land use, economic base, population, housing and neighborhoods, municipal costs and revenues, transportation, streets and traffic, and community facilities.

It also provides for preparation of a Comprehensive Development Plan which includes plans for land use, transportation, and community facilities; preparation of a central business district plan; preparation of a capital improvements program and public improvements program; and preparation or revision of a zoning ordinance and subdivision regulations.
