Top Personnel Honored by State Police

State Police Det. William E. Chandler, Grand Haven, and Trooper C. Valley, Center Line, have been cited for meritorious service by the department's board of awards, Commissioner Joseph A. Childs announced.

Five other officers won honorable mention recognition.

Detective Chandler was cited for solving a series of thefts of money totalling at least \$33,255.03 from a farmers' cooperative agency in a western Michigan community by a veteran employee of the firm. The amount was recovered by the officer during the investigation.

The employee, who made an additional restitution of \$2,000, pleaded guilty to a grand larceny charge and was sentenced to five years probation, six months in jail at the discretion of the court and paid costs of \$300.

Trooper Valley, disregarding his own safety during a traffic violation stop, saved a truck driver from serious injury or possible death by pushing him out of the way of an oncoming car. Valley himself was struck by the vehicle and suffered a compound fracture of the right leg, lacerations of the

high and a damaged knee joint, necessitating hospitalization for two months.

The officers receiving honorable mention for their services were Troopers Delbert A. Cody, Werner A. Cyrax and Kenneth E. Viet, East Lansing post, and Earl P. Dyzyet and Lincoln Gursuch, Rockford.

Alertness on patrol by Troopers Dyzyet and Gursuch resulted in the arrest within four hours of three subjects who had stolen \$231 from a flume station.

Suspicious of circumstances involving a burned car, Trooper Viet, then stationed at Wakefield, thoroughly investigated the incident with the result that the owner admitted setting the fire to collect \$150 in insurance.

Notified by a relative that a woman had threatened suicide, Troopers Cody and Cyrax rushed to the subject's home and found her unconscious from taking a poison. They succeeded in reviving her to apply emergency treatment, then took her to a hospital where she fully recovered.
