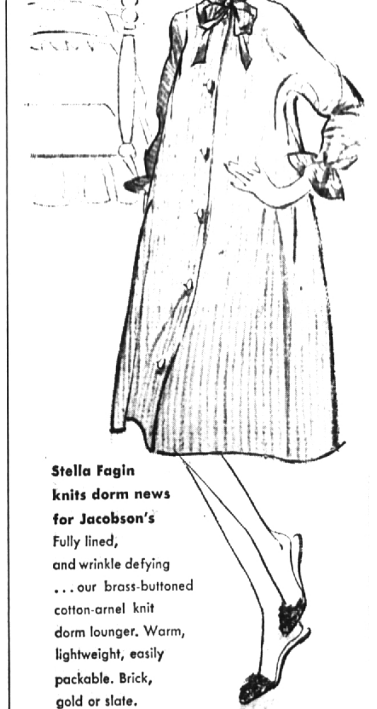

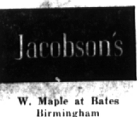
Engaged

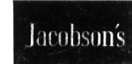

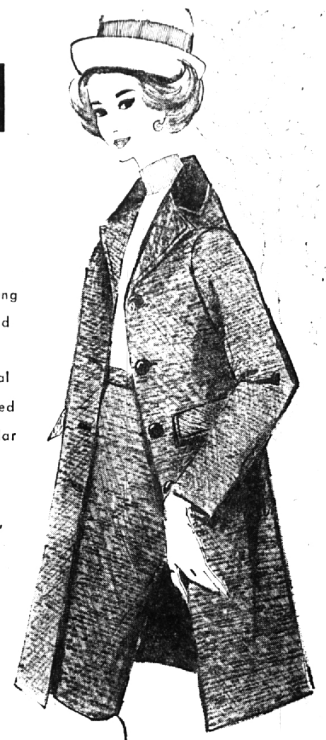

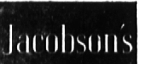
