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Pythian Sisters Schedule Meeting

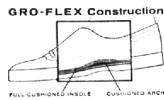
The Pythian Sisters, Birmingham Temple 34, will hold its first regular meeting of the season on Wednesday evening at 8 at the Birmingham Community House.

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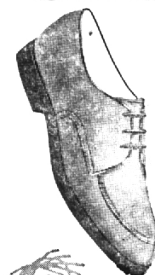
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
