MADONNA LILIES

These beautiful white lilies are known as
far back as 1500 B.C. They are thought to be
the "Lilies of the Field" which Christ
knew and to which He referred in His Ser-
mon on the Mount.

In addition to their aesthetic beauty they
also are cultivated for their medicinal value
as a skin cleansing preparation and even a
treatment for wounds.

Now they are grown for their beauty alone,
and these bulbs are grown in the Loire Valley
of Northern France.

Plant in fall—right now, to be specific.
Cover the bulbs with not more than 2" of
soil.

A group of leaves may come up this fall,
but they will die off and serve as winter
protection.

Next spring new growth will start and a
generous mass of pure white flowers will be
produced.

Give them full sun and feed them only once
a year (after blooming) with 4-12-4 or 5-10-5.

Treat them nicely and they will produce
exquisite blooms year after year and will
multiply in large clumps.
