Weapons Charge Brought Against Area Resident

WEST BLOOMFIELD—A Walled Lake resident was arraigned Monday afternoon on charges of carrying a concealed weapon after he had previously been released from the Montgomery County Jail.

Lewis Nomsson, 70, was first arrested Nov. 21 and taken to the Montgomery jail, along with Lawrence Whitmore, 41, the injured man, told Alpena Post State Police that he spent most of the night in the cabin, located north-west of Hillman, and then dragged himself to the road. A passing motorist took him to the hospital where he underwent emergency surgery.

NOMSSON ADMITTED shooting Whitmore following an argument. Bedford Post State Police said the Montgomery County prosecutor refused to issue a warrant, however, on the basis that evidence indicated that the shooting was in self-defense. The two men were released but on Monday morning, Oakland County Assistant Prosecutor Gerald Berry authorized a warrant for Nomsson on the concealed weapons charge.

BEDFORD POST detectives, who arrested Nomsson both times, said he had the .32 calibre weapon, allegedly used in the shooting, on him when he was arrested the first time.

Nomsson was arraigned before Walled Lake Justice of the Peace Gene Schnella who issued the warrant. He was released on \$250 bond.

Hearing Date For Woodward Access Set

A public hearing to determine necessity will be held Dec. 17 for a proposed access drive on the west side of Woodward north of Smith St.

Birmingham city commissioners set the date for the hearing at their meeting Monday night.

The access drive is requested by the Becker Orthopedic Appliance Co., to provide parking in front of a building it is constructing at 1776 S. Woodward.

The firm is now located at Elm and Hunter.

CITY ENGINEER William T. Killen estimates that the drive, which would provide six parking spaces, would cost \$2,600.

The property owners would be assessed 100 per cent for the cost of the project.
