Pork, Fryers, Fruit Best Buys for Month

With Christmas near, even food budgets stretch to provide one more goodie for the stocking or a festive one for the family.

Total food supplies are about the same as last month, according to county marketing agent Mrs. Josephine Lawyer, which means plenty of choices for good things to eat. Turkey naturally will be one of the big holiday choices, but prices on them are expected to be somewhat higher than they were last year.

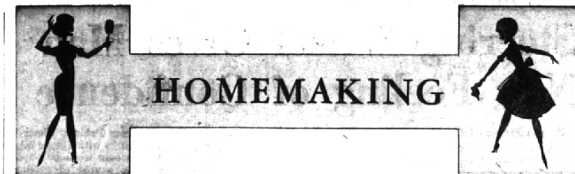
HAM IS the preferred pork cut during the holiday season, and for this reason, shoppers are willing to pay a little more per pound for it.

LARGE AMOUNTS of processed fruit juices (canned, frozen and chilled) will be available between now and the first half of 1963.

Endive and escarole should be plentiful from now through the holiday with the amount and quality of lettuce improving during the month.

THE TOTAL crop of tree nuts is 32 per cent less than last year and about 12 per cent below average. When buying, remember that it takes approximately two pounds of them in the shell to make one pound of nut meats—and one pound of nut meats is equal to three or four cups.

Express Your Personality In Choice of Accessories

Your personality should find expression in each accessory you place in your home. "Choosing appropriate accessories is a matter of knowing yourself, using basic rules of design and planning before you buy," says Patricia Klobe, Michigan State University home furnishings specialist.

Styles you use in your basic furnishings indicate your preferences and are a basic for choosing accessories, the specialist points out. For instance, if you decide upon an Early American decorating scheme, choose milk glass or landscape paintings that coordinate with that period.

"HOBBIES, be they painting, embroidery, hunting or collecting, give a unique quality to your home," Miss Klobe says, "if good taste is shown in their selection and display."

Accessories, such as pillows, ashtrays, lamps, clocks and flower containers may be both useful and beautiful—or they may be only decorative, as are pictures, figurines and plants."

Floor-length Knit Has Elegant Touch For Evening-Wear

One of the most elegant looks for a dinner dress this year is the floor-length knit.

It combines that wonderful blend of elegance and simplicity we have all admired in daytime knits. Perhaps this can be an excuse for those knitting projects that get out of hand. Now they can say their projects are too short instead of too long.

In caring for any type of knit garment, remember never to hang it on hangers. Always fold and place it in a drawer.

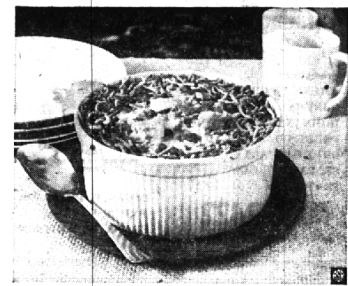
Let each accessory or group of accessories have plenty of background space so that the eye rests in definite places and does not jump about the room.

Avoid Confusion On Durability, Wear of Carpets

Two factors should be considered in making a wise carpet choice: appearance retention and durability.

Don't confuse the two, even though you may be thinking of both when you ask, "How long will this rug wear?" Durability means abrasion-resistance of the pile surface and the sturdiness of the backing.

A carpet is considered worn out when surface fibers actually disappear or when the backing no longer holds together.

YOU MAY think a carpet looks "worn," however, if it is extremely crushed, matted or soiled.

To make a wise choice remember that quality of construction aids in appearance retention but that color and design also play a part.

For example, a solid white carpet will show soil more easily than a darker shade, regardless of its quality.

FOR PRACTICALITY, choose medium colors and designs which will show footprints and daily use the least and help disguise soil between cleanings.

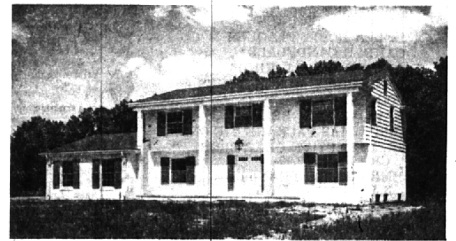

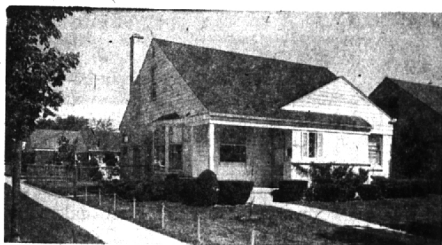

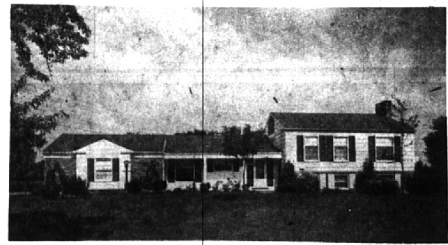
