The following resolution was offered by Councilman Shephard and supported by Councilman McClanathan:

1. That pursuant to the Village Charter and the statute in such case made and provided, the following amendment to the Charter of the Village of Beverly Hills be placed on the ballot to be voted upon by the qualified electors of the Village of Beverly Hills at the regular Village election to be held on March 11th, 1963, said proposal to read as follows:

"Shall the Charter of the Village of Beverly Hills be amended by the addition of a new subsection to be known as Sub-Section 4.10 (a), reading as follows:

Section 4.10 (a), Effective on the first day after the regular Village election in 1964 notwith-standing any other provision or provisions of this Charter the office of Village Clerk shall be appointive. The Clerk shall be appointed by and hold office at the pleasure of the Council which body will also set the salary of the Clerk in accordance with budget appropriations.
