At a regular meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, held at the Village Office at 18500 West 13 Mile Road at said Village on Monday, November 19th, 1962, at 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time;
PRESENT: Allerton, Cline, Guilmet, McClanathan, Shephard, Shurtlett and Wood

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Shephard and supported by Councilman McClanathan:
1. That pursuant to the Village Charter and the statute in such case made and provided, the following amendment to the Charter of the Village of Beverly Hills be placed on the ballot to be voted upon by the qualified electors of the Village of Beverly Hills at the regular Village election to be held on March 11th, 1963, said proposal to read as follows:
"Shall the Charter of the Village of Beverly Hills be amended by the addition of a new subsection to be known as Sub-Section 4.10 (a), reading as follows:
Section 4.10 (a). Effective on the first day after the regular Village election in 1964 notwithstanding any other provision or provisions of this Charter the office of Village Clerk shall be appointive. The Clerk shall be appointed by an hold office at the pleasure of the Council which body will also set the salary of the Clerk in accordance with budget appropriations.

Yoga Seen As an Aid To Skiers

Think you're ready for the skiing season? Think because you've been doing push ups, dead lifts and deep knee bends that your muscles are in top shape?

Sure, nobody will deny that a powerful set of legs are necessary for the Valuga, Parsenn or Olympic downhill. But what about the rest, the weekend skiers?

HELEN SWAN, yoga teacher at the Birmingham YMCA, says she has the answer and has prepared a practical route for skiing readiness in two seminars to be held at the "Y."

Mrs. Swan stresses flexibility and cites yoga as the only form of physical exercises for the true skier.

REALIZING THAT early in the season, ski pants have much more stretch than the skier. Mrs. Swan will have her students touching their noses to their knees in short order.

Any good skier knows that good waden demands a flexible lower back, and the "Y" yoga teacher claims that this must be accomplished through slow exercises, with an awareness of all parts of the body involved.

BREATHING PROPERLY will be stressed in the classes. Yoga breathing will enlarge the skiers lung capacity and can snap him back from weariness.

The simple exercises Mrs. Swan has prepared for area skiers are said to have amazing results. The adult sessions will be held at 400 E. Lincoln in the evening, Tuesday, Dec. 11 from 8:30 to 9:30. Two sessions for children will be offered on Saturdays, Dec. 8 and 15, 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.
