Toys Damaged In Store Fire At Northland

Two maintenance men employed by the J. L. Hudson Company's Northland store were overcome by smoke in a fire that broke out in the store's toy department Sunday afternoon.

Firemen said that an electrical water damage was done to toys and equipment in the department when five sprinkler heads broke. Some smoke damage in adjacent lower level departments in the store was reported by firemen.

SOUTHFIELD POLICE were called at 1:05 p.m. after the automatic alarm alerted Northland police. The Southfield department called the Detroit department for assistance and the fire was brought under control after two hours. The fire may have been caused by a short in a faulty extension cord used for temporary lighting in the department, firemen said.
