22 Township Residents Give Support to Case

A "Citizens for Case" committee has been organized and officers elected at a meeting in Bloomfield Township.

Some 22 residents of the township who support Homer Case for Bloomfield Township supervisor met at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lowry, 1420 Ashover, Chapel Hills subdivision.

After expressing their support of Case who announced his candidacy for the supervisor position two weeks ago, Birmingham attorney Dale A. Winnie, 135 Chewton, was named chairman of the committee.

CASE, who lives at 839 Helston, has been treasurer of Bloomfield Township for the past six and one-half years. During his tenure as treasurer, the township board appointed him public safety director. The fire department was reorganized during this period and three new fire stations were constructed.

A lifelong resident of the township, Case and his wife Mary have two sons at home, Ronald and David, and one son, James who is married and a resident of Pontiac. Village Residents Oppose Clean-out Of Area Drain

BEVERLY HILLS—A proposed clean-out of the South Berkshire Drain at an estimated cost of \$20,144.55 met with some opposition at its last council meeting as many residents of the area turned out to protest the action.

A public hearing on the necessity for the clean-out was set for Jan. 21 at 8 p.m.

Councilman Dr. Douglas J. Wood pointed out that the clean-out of the drain—which runs along 13 Mile Road to Evergreen, turns South toward 12½ Mile Road and includes many other streets—was proposed a year ago but was tabled at that time. Dr. Wood pointed out that the standing water in the drain is a health hazard.

THE \$20,144.55 FIGURE, which would work out to \$50 or \$60 per home owner, represents estimates made a year ago.

"Why should just a few pay?" was the main question asked by the residents. Dr. Wood pointed out that the users should be the ones assessed.

Mrs. Irving Chambers, 30665 Stellmar, and Kaiter Witoszynski, 29100 Elwood, spoke against the clean-out. Ralph Morens, 30600 Marimoor, was for it.

Lathrup to Get Cost Analyses for 2 Drainage Plans

LATHRUP — City Engineers Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May have been directed to provide comparative cost analyses of two plans for storm drainage south of 11 Mile Road which is not included in the present storm sewer system, now under construction.

With an eye to future development of the area, Mayor Richard N. Cogger proposed cost figures for a plan providing drainage south to the McKinley drain and for a plan bringing the drainage west into the Santa Barbara drain.

The county has just completed ditching south of the AAA building near 10½ Mile Road to provide drainage south into the McKinley.

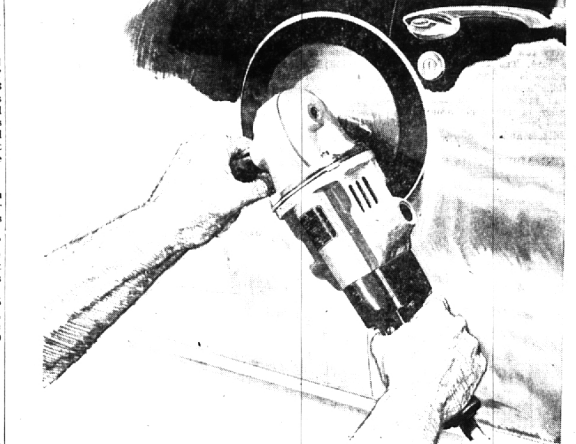
