

## Kelleys Move to Block Lathrup X-Way Route

LATHRUP—Postponement of a hearing was the latest development in a legal fight begun last week by Lathrup developers Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley to keep the East-West Expressway (I-696) off of 11 Mile Road in Lathrup.

The county road commission had been ordered to show cause Monday in circuit court why a writ should not be issued forcing the

commission to vacate 98 feet of right-of-way on either side of 11 Mile through the city.

Robert O. Felt, road commission member, said he did not know when the hearing would be held.

THE KELLEYS want the 98 feet taken from the present 204 feet right of way which would reduce the strip to a width of 106 feet, a length the Lathrup developers contend would make 11 Mile less attractive to the state highway department.

The Kelleys earlier this year asked the vacation from the road commission which turned down the request.

Felt said the request was turned down because the cities of Lathrup and Southfield objected to the vacation.

Felt said also that it is not usually the policy of the road commission to vacate land along a main county road.

IN A RESOLUTION Sept. 24, the Lathrup council officially opposed the abandonment of the right-of-way. The council indicated it needed the land to protect present and future utility easements.

The commission asked Southfield in September whether it objected to the abandonment. Southfield then asked the commission to put the city on record as objecting to vacating the right-of-way.

The Kelleys said, in their bill of complaint, that the right-of-way was 106 feet until 1925. It was then enlarged to its present width.

They claimed the strips delay development, do not contribute to harmonious development and are intended.

THE EXPRESSWAY'S official route now ends one block south of 11 Mile Road at Laker. It resumes again at 11 Mile Road in Center Line, a half-mile east of Mount.

The route between these two points is expected to be decided upon within 12-18 months.

## Church Guild Holds Christmas Luncheon

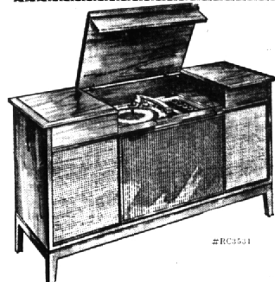

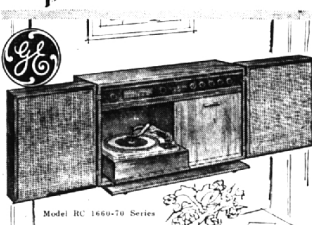
Members contributed canned goods and staples to make up three or four baskets for deserving families. Contributions were also made to supplement the basket contents with small gifts.
