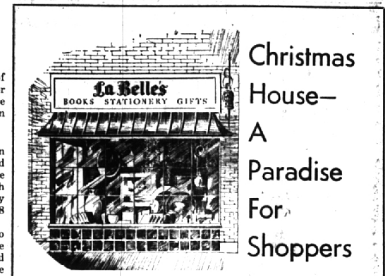
Four to 12-year-old girls will collect candy canes and gifts from Santa in their frilliest dresses during the 10 a.m. to noon children's party, which includes lunch.

Teenage girls in dressy or semi-formal frocks and boys in white shirts and suits will step



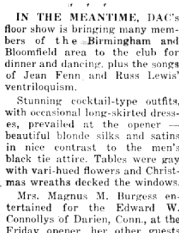
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
