Mrs. Herman Wagner

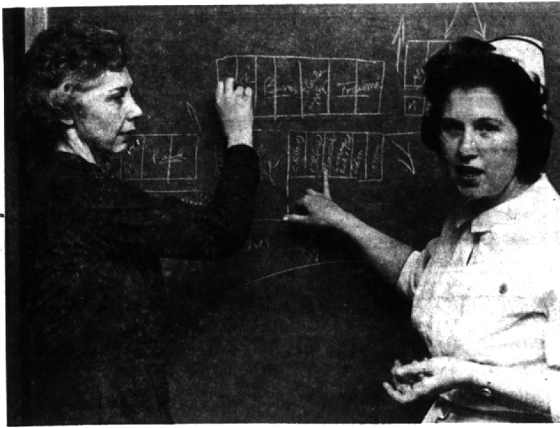
