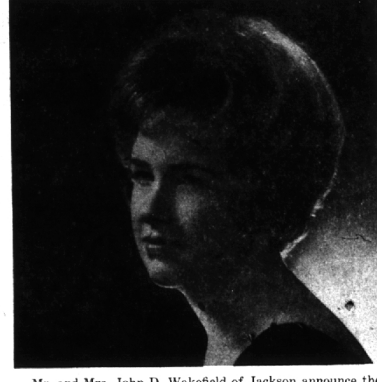


Romance Headlines Holiday Calendar
