## NEW YEAR'S EVE DANCE

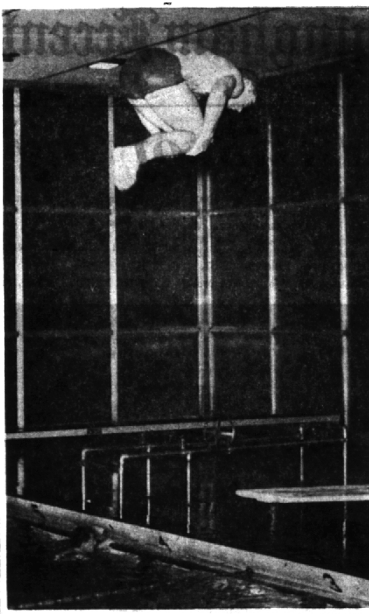

### ROLLER SKATING

### NATURAL ICE RINKS

Weather permitting, ice rink locations have been set at the following locations:

## Pupils Learn From Testing

What the student can learn about himself is the most important reason for giving standardized tests in high school.

The guidance director for the Oakland County Board of Education, Dr. William F. Moorhouse, has emphasized this advice in a newsletter to junior and senior high school counselors.

"If adequate counseling time is not available to assist pupils and their parents in understanding test results with a proper degree of accuracy, the schools must have other reasons of definite importance to justify testing," Dr. Moorhouse stated.

At elementary-school level teachers can use standardized test results in combination with their own tests and what they observe to better determine the individual instructional needs of pupils.

Neither parents nor teachers, he added, should consider test results alone. "They should be used only in their proper perspective with other information. Tests will provide valuable additional information about pupils and they will provide clues for further investigation. They do have limitations which we must always keep in mind."

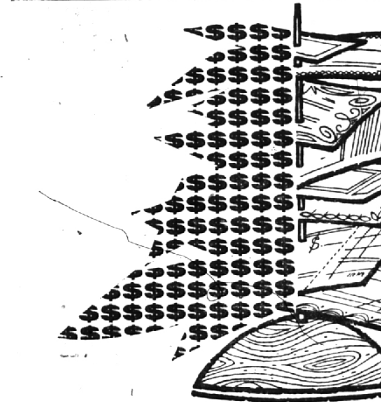
