## Name Cutter Chairman for College Drive

George O. Cutter of 618 Overhill Rd., Birmingham, director of the comptroller's staff of Fisher Body Division, General Motors Corp., Warren, has been appointed chairman of the Detroit Area for the \$40 million Bowdoin College Campaign.

His appointment was announced by Vincent B. Welch of Washington, D. C., alumni chairman of the nationwide fund-raising effort by the Brunswick, Me., liberal arts college for men.

Cutter, secretary of his Bowdoin Class of 1927, received his bachelor of science degree from the college that year. He took graduate studies at Harvard University, which granted him his master's degree in 1929.
