Ordinance Group Helps Nations Says Local Exec

"Detroit area industrial executives, who join military-industry associations should either be prepared to spend some time with such organizations in fulfilling national objectives—or stay out!"

That flatly is the opinion of Robert N. Green, of Bloomfield Hills, president of Automotive Materials Corp., Detroit. Green is conducting an informal evaluation of area members on behalf of the American Ordnance Association, of which he is a member, following recent charges leveled by some defense and industry executives that "there are too many military-industry associations" concerned with national defense.

"THAT'S ANOTHER way of saying I can't be bothered attending meetings," Green said. "Too many executives, he added, are prone to join such organizations for whatever advantage they offer in connection with defense contracts, rather than from the standpoint of the association's reason for existing—gathering and exchanging know-how for safeguarding national interests.

In the case of the ordnance association, for example, he said, "we are only too fully aware of the demands placed on the time of busy executives. But in peacetime, there is no establishment in industry to provide ordnance. To date, there is no establishment in industry that has assured continued know-how in ordnance.

YOU CANNOT order a tank from a catalog. Either our armed forces have the weapons, or we lose the war, Green explained.

Weapons systems are hard to produce. No other commodity demands more engineering skill and capability to insure reliability and safety, he emphasized.

Also, there is no stable market for weapons. Even when large sums are spent in their demand and their production rates. Government procurement policies give no assurance of follow-up on contracts on hand. Thus, ordnance is expensive, said Green.

THE ORDNANCE association, he said, bridges the gap between government and industry. It catalyzes timely and economical production of weapons, and weapons

readiness is the crux of our national defense."

Green, who lives in Turtle Lake Farms, assumed the presidency of his firm in 1947 at the age of 29; is president of Standard Cotton Products Co. of Flint.

He saw action in World War II as an aircraft ordnance and B-29 remote control specialist and, during the Korean conflict, was a special industry assistant to the Secretary of the Navy.
