B'ham Savings Rate Higher Than Usual

NEW YORK—Residents of Birmingham are living well within their incomes. They are spending much less than they are earning. Some of the surplus is being used to reduce their installment debt. The remainder, or a considerable part of it, is going into savings.

The evidence is seen in the rise in bank deposits and in savings and loan accounts and in the gap between family income and family expenditures.

THE FINDINGS arise from a study of consumer credit in the United States, made by economist Sidney Weintraub, based on data compiled by the Department of Commerce, the Federal Reserve System and others.

For families in most income levels, it appears, the rate of saving was higher than usual in the past year. Those with net after-tax earnings of \$3,000, were at the lowest end of the savings scale. They put aside less than 2.5 per cent of that amount, on the average, during the year.

Families with \$6,000 net saved about 6.5 per cent. The rate rose rapidly as incomes advanced to the higher levels.

Seek Higher Buildings on Newton Land

Two requests for rezoning of property were referred to the plan board by city commissioners last week.

The Garnes Co., Inc., 7621 Woodward, Detroit, seeks rezoning from R-5 to R-7 for the so-called Newton property on the west side of Woodward between the Glen Terrace and Colonial courts.

Involved in the request are six acres of property running back to the River Rouge.

Under R-5 zoning, the property is limited to apartment buildings of two stories, 30 feet high. Under R-7, the zoning could erect four-story buildings, 50 feet high.

The property is now restricted under an Oakland Circuit Court decree to an R-5 use, with a limit of 85 units. The petitioner seeks to build larger apartments, and the only way this could be done would be to build higher.

BIRMINGHAM CHURCH of Christ requested a change from single and two-family to multiple family (R-5) zoning for property on Lincoln Ave. near Floyd.

The petition was signed by G. Wheeler Uley, chairman of the trustees.

He said the present zoning is no longer considered desirable because of the location of commercial property across the street.

The plan board will study both requests and then make its recommendations to the city commission.

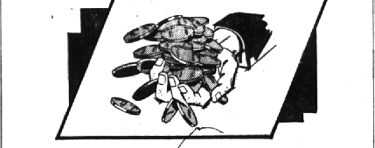
