Traffic Safety Problems Pondered by Citizens

Traffic safety ranks No. two slightly behind education, among the major problems facing Michigan in the opinion of 12,600 citizens who replied to questionnaires distributed by the Michigan Citizens Highway Safety Action 15-point driver license suspension program was "fair".

Fifty-eight per cent of those replying said that traffic law enforcement in their areas was "about right," while 32 per cent said they were average and the remaining 29 per cent said there was "too much."

Platt said only two per cent rated themselves as below average as a driver, while 69 per cent said they were average and the remaining 29 per cent said there was "too much."

EMPLOYMENT, crime prevention and public health, in that order, were considered less important than education and traffic safety, he said.
